# **INTRODUCTION**

This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather and spend time reflecting and discussing about the scripture readings of 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of Easter. On the same day, the Church celebrates Divine Mercy Sunday.

# SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read John 20: 19-31. Then, as a family reflect on the questions given below and share your responses with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding.

Time of reflection and response:

- What are your main concerns/ anxieties in the face of the Covid-19 pandemic? Why do you feel this way?
- In the face of these concerns/anxieties, how would you describe your own relationship with Jesus at this moment.
- What do you feel the Lord is telling or showing you through the present circumstances?

The past year has been a time of great concern for many people. Although the Covid-19 situation may have improved, most of us are still anxious about the well-being of our loved ones, and for the welfare of our nation and the whole world. When will it really come to end? Will everything return to normal?

Thomas doubted because *he could not personally see the Risen Christ*. He wanted *proof* that Jesus had risen. We too may have our doubts and anxieties at this moment because we are unable to "see" what the future holds.

Jesus told Thomas: "Doubt no longer but believe". Today, Jesus assures us with the same words. God is merciful and compassionate. He understands our anxieties and assures us that He is with us, and has revealed His divine mercy to us. Let us trust Him at all times – even in the most difficult of circumstances.

# Activity #10 – Hands of Mercy Art Craft

This activity will help children come up with ideas for works of mercy using their hands. The fingers represent the rays streaming from our Lord's merciful heart in the Divine Mercy image.

You will need:

- Plain white paper
- Marker pen
- Crayons or coloured pencils

# Instructions:

- 1. Trace the child's hands with palms down on a paper with thumbs and index fingers touching and forming a heart shape. You may also use a template of traced hands.
- 2. Have your child write works of mercy that they are able to perform on each finger.
- 3. Colour the hands to represent the Blood and Water (may be red and blue) that are a symbol of the Divine Mercy image. Have your child write a message to Jesus and their name inside the heart.
