

INTRODUCTION

This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather and spend time reflecting and discussing about the scripture readings of 3rd Sunday of Easter.

HOW TO USE THE MATERIAL

This document contains activities that members of the family may complete individually (just the children), in pairs (with parental assistance), or as an entire family. It would be helpful to print a hard-copy, so that members of your family may carry out different activities at the same time.

WHEN TO USE THE MATERIAL

During the week after the family has celebrated the Mass of 3rd Sunday of Easter.

OPENING PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we have gathered here in the name of Jesus. Give us the Peace that we can receive only through Your Son, Jesus. Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Peace, guide us during this family gathering. We make this prayer in Jesus' name, Amen.



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read Luke 24: 35-48. Then, as a family reflect on the questions given below and share your responses with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding.

Time of reflection and response:



Imagine that your family and you are at home. You are all gathered in one place having a conversation. Suddenly Jesus appears and stands in front of you. What would be the first thing you would do?

If Jesus asks you for something to eat, what will you tell him? What will you offer Jesus?

Jesus comes to bring us peace. What do you think is the best way for us to receive the peace of Jesus?

Jesus comes to console his disciples who are fearful and filled with doubt. When they see Jesus, they are frightened because they think he is a ghost. After all, they believed that he had died. Jesus comes to comfort them with his peace and to strengthen their faith. He shows his wounds and allows them to touch him. To show that is he really alive, he asks them for food and eats in front of them.

Often, we too may be fearful or filled with doubt in the face of difficult and challenging situations. At times like these, we may feel that Jesus is not with us or we may not believe that he is the Lord of our lives.


Jesus assures us that he is with us always. He wants to give us his peace. To receive his peace, we have to believe in and trust Jesus completely. Jesus also wants us to be his witnesses, that is, to tell other people about him and what he is doing for us. Jesus is alive, Alleluia!

Below you will find some activities for younger children, revolving around the first reading and the Gospel passage. Select the activities you would like to complete with your children, or try to complete them all if you can!


Two of the disciples told their story about how they met Jesus on the road to Emmaus.
