INTRODUCTION

This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather and spend time reflecting on and doing the activities related to the gospel reading of 11^{th} Sunday of Ordinary Time.

HOW TO USE THE MATERIAL

This document contains activities that members of the family may complete individually (just the children), in pairs (with parental assistance), or as an entire family. It would be helpful to print a hard-copy, so that members of the family may carry out different activities at the same time.

WHEN TO USE THE MATERIAL

During the week after the family has celebrated the Mass of 11th Sunday of the Year.

OPENING PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we have gathered here in the name of Jesus. Thank you for reminding us that even if we have faith as small as a mustard seed, we can do great things for you. Holy Spirit, guide us during this family gathering. We make this prayer in Jesus' name, Amen.



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read **Mark 4: 26-34**. Then, as a family reflect on the questions given below and share your responses with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding.

Time of reflection and response:

Simple things we say or do can have a big influence. One person can affect many, even without knowing it. The kingdom of God grows of its own power in the world, and nobody can stop it, like good seed growing under the ground.

God is the God of here, there and everywhere. Seeds may sprout anywhere in the field, and the kingdom can find its way into the lives of individuals and communities in ways that may be surprising and amazing.

The mustard seed becomes a tree for all; the kingdom of God is for every man, woman and child. Have you ever brought something of the kingdom of God – of love and peace, prayer and faith, justice and hope to people around you? Today, let us reflect on God's reign in our lives and in the world.

Lord, help me realise that my task is to sow seeds, no matter how small they may be, and to trust that they will sprout and grow, and come to harvest in your good time.

- 1. How aware am I of God's reign in my own life? In what ways can I allow the reign of God to transform me daily?
- 2. How have I welcomed the gifts of God, no matter how small they may be, in my life? What are the three 'gifts' God has given or is giving me that I am grateful for?

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3 How am I sharing the gifts I am receiving from God with others?


FOLLOW-UP ACTIVITIES

Activity #10: Parable of the Mustard Seed Activity.



Materials needed:

- A4 size blue paper or any other suitable colour paper.
- Brown paper.
- Green paper.
- Scrap of white paper.
- Stickers of birds or make your own with colourful paper that is found around the house, kitchen, or magazines,
- Glue, markers, crayons, scissors.
- 1. The blue paper is the background.
- 2. Cut a tree trunk out of the brown paper by cutting two curved lines (as in the picture). This is the trunk
- 3. Glue trunk to bottom middle of blue paper.
- 4. Hand out green paper.
- 5. Fold green paper.
- 6. Cut hearts out of green paper. These are the leaves.
- 7. Glue leaves on top of the tree trunk.
- 8. Glue small square of white paper on blue paper. Write "Size of mustard seed" on white paper.
- 9. Draw tiny black dot on white paper. This is the mustard seed (as in picture).
- 10. With red crayon, draw an arrow from white square to tree.
- 11. Write "Size of Mustard Tree" in the middle of the tree trunk.
- 12. Write "PARABLE OF THE MUSTARD SEED" at the top of the blue paper.
- 13. Cut out two birds out of colourful magazines, empty boxes, discarded colour paper, etc.
- 14. Glue birds to the leaves in the tree.
