INTRODUCTION

This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather and spend time reflecting and discussing about the scripture readings of 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time.

HOW TO USE THE MATERIAL

This document contains activities that members of the family may complete individually (just the children), in pairs (with parental assistance), or as an entire family. It would be helpful to print a hard-copy, so that members of your family may carry out different activities at the same time.

WHEN TO USE THE MATERIAL

During the week after the family has celebrated the Mass of 15th Sunday of Ordinary Time

OPENING PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we thank you for the gift of each one gathered here in your presence today. Help us to be aware that we are disciples of your Son, Jesus. May we be always ready to be sent by him to reach out to others. Holy Spirit, guide us during this family gathering. We make this prayer in Jesus' name, Amen.



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read Ephesians 1: 3-10. Then, ask another person to read Mark 6: 7-13. Then, as a family reflect on the commentary given below and share your responses to the questions with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding.

Time of reflection and response:

Adoption was not uncommon during Saint Paul's time. Among wealthy people, it served the important function of allowing for an heir if one had no children, or if one's children had died. The adopted person (who could be a child or an adult) gained social status through association with the parent's social status.

The adopted child could also benefit from the social and political connections of his or her parents and gain wealth through their inheritance. In return the adopted child honoured the parents through taking the their name and by being loyal to them.

The adoption mentioned by Saint Paul in his letter is unique because it is not the adoption of an individual but of a people. It is an adoption that is related to God's choosing the nation of Israel as His people and His continued love and protection for them. Through the sacrifice of Jesus, we too have been adopted by God to be His children, and we can call God, "Our Father".

- 1. During Saint Paul's time, an adopted child could benefit from the wealth and social connections of his or her parents. In what way(s), do you think that we, as Christians, benefit or gain from being adopted children of God?
- 2. The child who was adopted is expected to honour his or her parents and to be loyal to them. How do you think Christians can honour and be loyal to God?


Below you will find some activities for younger children, revolving around the second reading and the Gospel passage. Select the activities you would like to complete with your children, or try to complete them all if you can!



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
