

INTRODUCTION

This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather and spend time reflecting and discussing about the scripture readings of 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time.

HOW TO USE THE MATERIAL

This document contains activities that members of the family may complete individually (just the children), in pairs (with parental assistance), or as an entire family. It would be helpful to print a hard-copy, so that members of your family may carry out different activities at the same time.

WHEN TO USE THE MATERIAL

During the week after the family has celebrated the Mass of 28th Sunday of Ordinary Time

OPENING PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we thank you for the gift of each one gathered here in your presence today. May we be ready to follow Jesus when he calls us. Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Wisdom and Peace, guide us during this family gathering. We make this prayer in Jesus' name, Amen.



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read **Mark 10: 17-30**. Then, as a family reflect on the questions given below and share your responses with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding.

Time of reflection and response:

The man who had great wealth found it difficult to give it away and to share it with others. Somehow, the Lord's invitation for the man to follow him threatened him badly. In actuality, the man's riches are not the main problem as such, but his attitude towards them. It is as if he is "possessed" by his own possessions, and not in charge of them.

Wealth and material things can subtly control our lives. They can prevent us from following Jesus closely.

- 1. Imagine that you are the rich man in the story. How would you have responded to Jesus' advice to give up all your wealth and to follow him? (Be honest with your response).
- 2. Why is it usually said that material things or worldly concerns get in the way of our relationship with God?
- 3. What are the real "riches" in life that God wishes to bless you with? How can you recognise and appreciate these "riches" in your daily life?
- 4. Describe a time when you could recognise God's blessing inspite of a difficult situation or experience you were going through. How did it make you feel?

The man who came to see Jesus had kept all the commandments since he was young. However, while Jesus praised the man for faithfully keeping the commandments, Jesus wanted the man to "let go of his possessions" so that the man may have an "abundance of life" by being close to Jesus. Jesus calls us to follow him closely and share in his life daily. May we listen to his voice!





Activity #10: The Rich Young Ruler

Materials needed: 6" x 18" light construction paper, colour pencils or crayons.

- 1. Fold in the paper in half.
- 2. Fold in half again.
- 3. With fold on the left, write "The Rich young Ruler" and "Mark 10: 17-30 on the cover. (See picture below)



- 4. Unfold once.
- 5. Draw the rich, young ruler saying, "What shall I do to inherit eternal life?"

- 6. Completely unfold to reveal four sections.
- 7. Trace on fold lines with a colour pencil or marker.
- 8. In Box #1, write "Do not commit adultery," "Do not kill," "Do not steal," "Do not bear false witness," and "Honor your father and mother."
- 9. In Box #2, draw the rich young ruler saying, "I have kept these from my youth."
- 10. In Box #3, write "Jesus said, Go. Sell all. Give to poor. Come. Follow me."
- 11. In Box #4, draw the rich young ruler very sad and sorrowful and write "He was very sad because he was very rich."
