

INTRODUCTION

This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather and spend time reflecting and discussing about the gospel reading of 30th Sunday of Ordinary Time.

HOW TO USE THE MATERIAL

This document contains activities that members of the family may complete individually (just the children), in pairs (with parental assistance), or as an entire family. It would be helpful to print a hard-copy, so that members of your family may carry out different activities at the same time.

WHEN TO USE THE MATERIAL

During the week after the family has celebrated the Mass of 30thth Sunday of Ordinary Time

OPENING PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we thank you for the gift of each one gathered here in your presence today. May we be ready to hear your voice and be ready to come to you when you call us. Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Wisdom and Peace, guide us during this family gathering. We make this prayer in Jesus' name, Amen.



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read **Mark 10: 46-52**. Then, as a family reflect on the questions given below and share your responses with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding.

Time of reflection and response:

When Bartimaeus hears the noise of the crowd, he naturally wants to know what is going on and is told that Jesus of Nazareth is passing by. Immediately on hearing this he calls out, "Jesus, son of David, have pity on me!" It is a cry of a desperate man who wants something from Jesus.

- When or why do people cry in desperation to God?
- Share a personal experience when you cried out to the Lord in desperation?

When the people heard Bartimaeus crying out to Jesus, they scolded him and told him to be quiet but he shouted all the louder. It means Bartimaeus did not get discouraged or give up. He persevered in calling out to Jesus.

- Why do you think the people tried to prevent Bartimaeus from calling out to Jesus?
- Have you ever had an experience when you kept calling out to the Lord and became discouraged? How did you feel? What did you do?
- What lesson can you learn from Bartimaeus?

When Jesus called Bartimaeus to him, Bartimaeus threw off his cloak, jumped up and went to Jesus.

– Why do you think Bartimaeus threw off his cloak? Why was it important for the gospel writer to mention this?

Jesus asked Bartimaeus "What do you want me to do for you?"

 If Jesus asked you today, "What do you want me to do for you?", what would you ask him? Why?

Activity #10: Blind Man Healed Mask Art Craft

This craft will help you remember the story of Jesus healing a blind man. On one side of the mask, you have a sad face with bandages on his eyes. This side symbolizes the blind man before he was healed. And on the other side you have a happy face with a big smile who has now been healed by the miraculous power of Christ.



THINGS NEEDED:

- Template of "happy and sad face" and two bandages (see below)
- 2. Colour pencils or crayons.
- 3. Two pieces of construction paper (same colour) A4 size.
- 4. Scissors.
- 5. Glue.
- 6. Popsicle or ice-cream stick; or you can use any other suitable stick.



WHAT TO DO:

- 1. Print and color the templates. (see below)
- 2. Cut out both faces and the bandages. You will need two bandages.
- 3. Glue each face onto a piece of construction paper. Both pieces of construction paper should be the same color.
- 4. Cut out the faces again, leaving a small border of construction paper.
- 5. Grab the happy face and place it facing down. Glue on a large popsicle stick for a handle.
- 6. While this is drying glue on the bandages to the eyes of the sad face.
- 7. Finally glue the sad face to the back of the happy face. The popsicle stick will be sandwiched in between both faces.
