INTRODUCTION

Dear parents and guardians. This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather and spend time reflecting and discussing about the gospel reading of 3rd Sunday of Lent.

HOW TO USE THE MATERIAL

This document contains activities that members of the family may complete individually (just the children), in pairs (with parental assistance), or as an entire family. It would be helpful to print a hard-copy, so that members of your family may carry out different activities at the same time.

WHEN TO USE THE MATERIAL

During the week after the family has celebrated the Mass of 3rd Sunday of Lent.

OPENING PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we have gathered here in the name of Jesus. May I always do what is right so that I may bear good fruit in all that I say and do in my daily life. Holy Spirit, guide us during this lesson. We make this prayer in Jesus' name, Amen.



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read Luke 13: 1-9. Later, reflect on the questions given together as a family, and share your responses with one another. (If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding).

Time for reflection and discussion:

- 1. The gardener plants the tree. He waters it, feeds it, and prunes it. Everything he does is aimed at growing a strong, healthy fruitful tree. God is the Master Gardener. Describe how you see God's loving hand in all that happens to you?
- 2. Jesus tells us about God's patience and mercy. God is always ready to give us more time, to trust in our capacity to bear fruit, even after many barren years. How satisfied are you with the fruit you have borne for the Lord so far? What do you feel needs to change in your life order for you to bear more fruit in the Lord's vineyard?

Some thoughts on today's scripture

The story about the fig tree is about the patience of God and our need for time to repent and grow in our faith and prayer. God who gives us many chances to repent and change. This is because God never let's go of us and always believes in our future.

All of us carry particular faults and failings in our lives, and even though we try our best, we find that some of these faults and failings remain with us. God knows this and sees our efforts to change and be renewed. The important thing is to always try to change our ways.

During the Season of Lent, Jesus calls us to return to him so that we can become true sons and daughters of God and become more like him. In this way, we may bear the fruit that God desires from us both in our lives and in the lives of others.

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Activity #10: Art and Craft Activity


Assembling your fig tree is super easy!
