INTRODUCTION

This material has been prepared to provide families an opportunity to gather and spend time reflecting and discussing about the scripture readings of the 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

HOW TO USE THE MATERIAL

This document contains activities that members of the family may complete individually (just the children), in pairs (with parental assistance), or as an entire family. It would be helpful to print a hard-copy, so that members of your family may carry out different activities at the same time.

WHEN TO USE THE MATERIAL

During the week after the family has celebrated the Mass of 17th Sunday of Ordinary Time.

OPENING PRAYER

Heavenly Father, we thank you for the gift of each one gathered here today. Thank you, Lord Jesus, for bringing us the gift of life and faith. Holy Spirit, the Spirit of Peace, guide us during this family gathering. We make this prayer in Jesus' name, Amen.



SCRIPTURE REFLECTION

Invite someone to read **Luke 11: 1-13**. Then, as a family reflect on the questions given below and share your responses with one another. If necessary, parents are encouraged to rephrase the information and questions according to their children's level of understanding.

Time of reflection and response:

Once, when Jesus had finished praying, one of his disciples said, 'Lord, teach us to pray.'

Why do you think the disciples asked Jesus to teach them how to pray? What was the prayer that Jesus taught his disciples? What did Jesus tell his disciples to ask for in that prayer?

Jesus also taught them to be persistent in their prayer. He said, 'Ask and it will be given to you; search and you will find; knock and the door will be opened. If you know how to give your children what is good, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him!'

Why do you think Jesus told his disciples to be persistent in praying? What do you ask for when you pray?

In the Gospel reading, Jesus teaches us to call God our Father, just as he does. He tells us that God is a father who wants to give us good things and asks us to never grow tired of praying for what we need and trusting that He will take care of us, His children. Therefore, let us ask the Holy Spirit to continue to guide us and teach us to pray for the graces that we need every day.

Say together as a family:

"Lord Jesus, you came down from heaven that we might have life in your name. You ask us to believe and to put our hope in you. We know that you love us and watch over us always. May we continue to grow in our faith and follow you, especially in times of trouble."

Each number represents a letter of the alphabet. Substitute the correct letter for the numbers to reveal the coded words.




